COUNCILLOR VELLUCCI

- WHEREAS: It has been a recognized fact that the yearly costs of energy, especially for heating, to Cambridge residents continues to rise at an unacceptable rate; and
- WHEREAS: The impact of these cost increases is especially hard on the less economically well-off segments of the community; and
- WHEREAS: It is also a recognized fact that low cost and no cost measures can be easily taken which demonstrate up to twenty percent (20%) savings in fuel bills; and
- WHEREAS: The Community Development Department of the City of Cambridge and Cambridge Community Services have already made a joint effort to form the Cambridge Action to Save Heat Program, known as CASH, by coordinating the efforts of the following agencies: Agassiz, Haggerty and Kennedy Community Schools, East End House, Homeowner's Rehab Inc., Just-A-Start, North Cambridge Planning Team, Riverside-Cambridgeport Community Corporation, and Somerville-Cambridge Economic Opportunities Committee; and
- WHEREAS: This group will endeavor to carry out a series of workshops at sites all across the City which will inform the public of measures they may take to cut energy costs; therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That the City Council goes on record giving all due support to the CASH Program in recognition of its vital interest to the City of Cambridge.
