COUNCILLOR WALTER SULLIVAN

- WHEREAS: John Aleck Lunn, who died March 30 at his home at 37 Larch Road, was a distinguished chemical manufacturing executive and consultant, having retired in 1960 as Vice-President of the Kendall Company; and
- WHEREAS: Mr. Lunn served as a member of the Cambridge Redevelopment Authority for twelve years (1958-70), as Treasurer for four terms and as Chairman for three terms; and
- WHEREAS: Mr. Lunn was a graduate of both Harvard and Massachusetts Institute of Technology, as well as Colorado State University from which institution he received an honorary Doctor of Science degree in 1956; and
- WHEREAS: Among Mr. Lunn's many business associations was a distinguished thirty-one year career with the Dewey and Almy Company where he headed the Cry-0-Vac division which developed the shrinkable plastic film used in packaging foods; and
- WHEREAS: Included among a score of affiliations, he was a Corporator at Massachusetts Institute of Technology; President of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology Alumni Association (1950-51); Trustee of Browne & Nichols School; President of the Franklin Foundation and Franklin Technical Institute; a Corporator of the North Avenue and Cambridge Savings Banks; and
- WHEREAS: Mr. Lunn served his country with the Army in France in World War II and headed a government agency that investigated the German chemical industry; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record as expressing the gratitude of the City of Cambridge for his many contributions to his beloved City and Country; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is required to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to the family of Mr. Lunn on behalf of the entire City Council.
