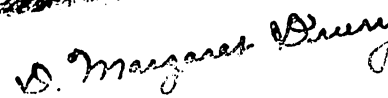

To the Honorable, the City Council:

I am hereby requesting the appropriation of a grant from the Massachusetts Technology Collaborative for \$337,500 to the Public Investment Fund Public Works Extraordinary Expenditures account to provide funds to cover the cost of creating the City's first Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) certified building for 57 Inman Street. The "Green Building" components of the project include: 1) solar photovoltaic panels on the roof to generate approximately 28 kilowatts of electricity; 2) a ground-source heat pump for more efficient heating and cooling; 3) high efficiency lighting and controls; 4) displacement ventilation system with heat recovery; 5) high performance windows; 6) high performance building envelope; and 7) carbon dioxide monitoring equipment. With these systems installed and certified, the City hopes to achieve a "gold" rating from LEEDs, setting an example for civic architecture in its consideration of the environment and use of renewable energy techniques.
