To the Honorable, the City Council:

The attached appropriation transfer, in the amount of \$18,740, has been requested by the Cambridge Arts Council to provide for the administration of its program from November 1, 1976 to June 30, 1977. Included in this request is:


\$12,010	for the Director's salary
3,335	to supplement the 9045 CETA salary for program coordinator
500	to supplement the 7165 CETA & Foundation Grant for a secretary
<u>2,895</u>	to supplement the 880 from donations for office supplies
\$18,740	total

The Council needs a Director to provide administrative leadership and to serve as a liaison to both private and public agencies in order to implement the programs of the Arts Council. The Director will prepare proposals and presentations to solicit funds to finance ongoing programs. These programs include the implementation of the Quality of Life project, involving a series of performances throughout the City as well as efforts to enhance the environment. An education program is being prepared to bring arts projects to students in the schools. The Arts Council will act as an advocate for art, supporting legislation that will bring art to the City. The Council plans to have a designer-in-residence who will concentrate on such areas as the design of exhibit space or City stationery. Finally, the Arts Council plans to negotiate a National Endowment Grant for placing a major work of art inside the new high school building.

While the Arts Council has been seeking private funding, it is essential for the Council to have financial support from the City, both to prove to private donors that the City is officially encouraging the Arts and to provide the staff to go after private funds. Therefore, a transfer of \$18,740 is needed to meet the needs of the Cambridge Arts Council.

Passage of the attached order is recommended.
