- WHEREAS: The Libraries for South African Schools Program is working to establish libraries in rural schools in South Africa that would not otherwise have access to libraries and library services; and
- WHEREAS: Representatives of the Cambridge Public Library have joined with the Libraries of South African Schools Program to promote the establishment of libraries and a culture of reading in South Africa; and
- WHEREAS: Representatives of the Cambridge Public Library are traveling to South Africa to support the Melani School Cluster in the Province of the Eastern Cape as they establish school libraries and promote a culture of reading; and
- WHEREAS: The Commonwealth of Massachusetts and the Province of the Eastern Cape signed a Sister State-Province Agreement in 1997 that encourages cooperation and exchange between the two regions; and
- WHEREAS: The cooperation between the Cambridge Public Library and the Melani School Cluster is a continuation of the many years of support that the City of Cambridge has provided to the democratic movement in South Africa; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That the City Council go on record lending its full support to the Cambridge Public Library and the Melani School Cluster in their joint efforts to promote libraries and the culture of reading.
