

In the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty one.

An Ordinance

Determining the boundaries of the wards of the City of Cambridge, and the number of members of the Common Council, which each ward shall be entitled to elect.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Cambridge, as follows: 1. That the boundaries of the several wards shall continue, for the next five years, to be the same as the boundaries of the wards into which the City of Cambridge is now divided.

2. The ward now known as Ward Number One shall elect five members of the Common Council; the ward now known as Ward Number Two shall elect nine members of the Common Council; and the ward now known as Ward Number Three shall elect six members of the Common Council.
