Dear Ms. Drury:

The License Commission announced yesterday evening, March 22, 1994 that it would make a decision this Thursday, March 24, 1994 whether or not to permit beer and wine restaurants to serve cordials and Liqueurs.

I would like to request that this decision be postponed until after the City Council has debated the issue on March 28, 1994 at the usual Monday night hearing.

This I feel is only fair since the usual time taken to come to a decision is generally two weeks. Since the hearing took place yesterday, and the decision will be made tomorrow, this leaves only one day for deliberation: this is unheard of since I have been going to the License hearings from 1990, for this type of issue. Much less important matters of an individual significance are made in two weeks: whereas this is of a general nature, of extreme importance, which effects the community at large. I feel it vitally needs to be heard at the City Council meeting in order that many opinions might be heard. Time is a factor, since tomorrow is the twenty fourth.
