I am writing in regard to two recent conflicting Orders made by Councillors to name the Hoyt Field Shelter in honor of both Thomas Coates and the late Willis Moore.

I recommend that the Hoyt Field Shelter be dedicated to Thomas Coates since the tot lot has already been named in honor of Willis Moore. I have discussed this matter with the mother of Willis Moore. Her only concern was that the City continue to name the tot lot after her son, and that a new sign be erected denoting her son's name.
