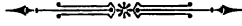

34. Holyoke St. Cambridge, July 27, 1882

To the Honorable the Mayor and Aldermen of the City of Cambridge

The undersigned respectfully petitions:

1. That curb-stones be set in the unfinished part of the West side-walk of Holyoke Street from South Street to Mount Auburn Street, the Abutters bearing the usual expenses;
2. That ^{the} breadth and grade of said side-walk be adjusted, the City or Abutters ^{bearing the cost,} as may be, and edge-stones and fences removed if necessary;
3. That a flagstone crossing be laid on the same side-walk over its intersection with Mount Auburn Street;
4. That the side-walk adjoining the property occupied by subscriber be laid in brick, he bearing the usual expenses.

I would feel obliged, Honorable Gentlemen, for the granting of this petition in full, or for a sufficient reason why any part thereof cannot nor should not be granted.
