That in the retirement of Elie H. LaPierre from the Board of Health the City of Cambridge loses the services of a public official who has given unstintingly of his time and talents for a quarter of a century.

Professor Elie H. LaPierre was appointed to the Board of Health on February 17, 1908. He served without interruption until his successor was appointed and confirmed on March 20, 1934. His resignation was forwarded to take effect on January 1st, but like the soldier at his post he carried on until his successor was ready to take up where he left off. His activities during a busy life have been such an exacting nature that to give even a portion of his spare time was a sacrifice, which he gladly and willingly made.

For a period extending over fifty years he has been a professor at the Massachusetts College of Pharmacy. He has for years been a member of the State Board of Registration of Pharmacy and is a recognized authority on Pharmaceutical matters having served on the U. S. Board on Revision of Pharmacopoeia.

To those who know him best he retires with honor and with a complete knowledge of a duty to his City well done. In the face of great difficulties, with patience and fortitude, with a courage that never faltered he has directed the work of the Health Department since 1908 and the City of Cambridge owes him a debt of gratitude for his conspicuous and meritorious service. It is further

That the City Council hereby records, by spreading upon the records, its appreciation of his long and faithful service, his honesty and sincerity of purpose and his tireless efforts for the welfare of the City, particularly in matters pertaining to their health.

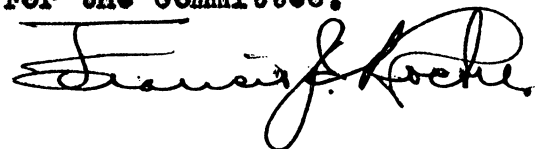
