To The Honorable, The City Council:

I am hereby requesting the appropriation of \$20,000 to the Public Celebrations (Arts Council) Other Ordinary Maintenance Account to help support the cost of the 18th Cambridge River Festival. The revenue for this appropriation will come from property taxes. The budget for the River Festival is approximately \$61,000, with \$41,000 coming from outside funding sources. The City support for the River Festival in FY95 was \$25,000; \$5,000 greater than this years request. In 1994, approximately 95,000 people attended this popular free celebration of the arts.
