In Board of Aldermen, Nov. 20, 1872

~~Ordered,~~ The Committee on Roads & Bridges to which was refer'd the petition of James Marsden for compensation for damage to building by reason of extension of Portland St., Reports.

That the City did not take any of Petitioner's land or building - He is in the unfortunate predicament that owners of parts of houses sometimes find themselves by reason of alterations or removal of the tenements adjoining, owned by other parties - But in this case, as the tenement to be removed was for some time for sale, (as known by the petitioner,) the remedy was in his hands - The City ~~xxx~~ is in nowise responsible for any damage to building, but it has made Petitioner's estate a corner lot on a wide, and probably to be a much used, thoroughfare - It is therefore recommended that he leave leave & withdraw -
