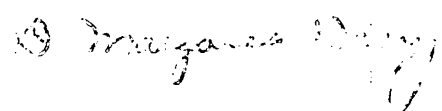

WHEREAS: This City Council was deeply saddened at learning of the death of Anthony Campagnone on July 15, 2006; and

WHEREAS: Anthony served in the Army and was discharged in 1946 as a captain in the antiaircraft artillery; and

WHEREAS: Anthony was a graduate of Milford High School and Northeastern University where he completed a combination undergraduate and Northeastern University School of Law program in six years; and

WHEREAS: In 1952 Anthony began his law practice, Hull & Campagnone; and

WHEREAS: Anthony served on the Milford School Committee from 1953 to 1959, was town counsel from 1957 to 1963 and was assistant district attorney of Worcester County from 1959 to 1970; and

WHEREAS: Anthony was appointed to the bench of the Uxbridge District Court in 1979 and was made presiding judge of the court in 1983, a position he held until his retirement in 1990; and

WHEREAS: Anthony was a member of the Sons of Italy, the Italian-American War Veterans Post of Milford, the Milford Lodge of Elks, the Portuguese-American Club and the Valencia Knights of Columbus; and

WHEREAS: Anthony was on the executive board of the Worcester County Bar Association, was legal counsel to the former Home National Bank of Milford, was trustee of the Milford Arthritis Foundation and a communicant of Sacred Heart of Jesus Church in Milford; and

WHEREAS: Anthony's passing will leave a void in the lives of all his surviving family, his wife Marguerite A. (Oliva) Campagnone; his children Marian Press, Angela R. Consigli, Charles J. and Anthony Campagnone Jr., his four grandchildren; and his siblings Josephine Bruno and William and Joseph Campagnone; and
