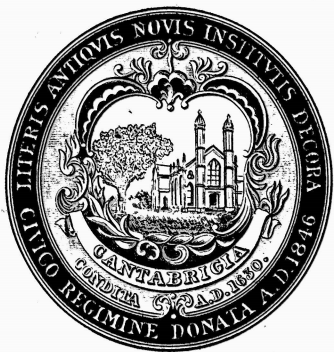
Dear Sir;-

Immediate action on the part of the City Council

street restriction upon the Ames and Souther lands,bordered  
by the Esplanade and Greenhalge Street.


