HOLMES, who has lived in the City of Cambridge since 1986, has been active in our community, particularly with senior citizens, since his arrival, serving as the current President of the Board of Cambridge-Somerville Elder Services, President of the National Association of Retired Federal Employees, and past president of the Cambridge Council on Aging, in which roles he has been instrumental in the building of the new Senior Center; and

WHEREAS: KENNETH D. HOLMES has been active in the affairs of the Episcopal church as well, is currently a member of the congregation of St. James Episcopal Church in Cambridge, and is past President of the Standing Committee for the Episcopal Dioceses of Massachusetts and the Union of Black Episcopalians; and

WHEREAS: In appreciation for seventy years of love, dedication, hard work, perseverance, and shining example, the family and friends of KENNETH D. HOLMES have endeavored to make his work and mission known to all; now therefore be it

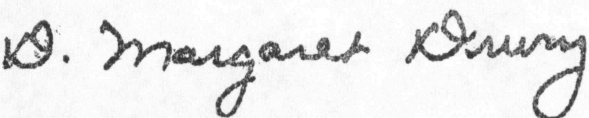
