Help seniors pay high cost of prescription drugs

money is fixed-income seniors," said Senate President Thomas F. Birmingham.

There is a compelling need to assist elders with their growing requirements for prescription drugs, particularly low-income seniors who cannot fit drug costs into their fixed-income budgets. These needs are supported by a recent national telephone survey conducted by the AARP (American Association of Retired Persons) in collaboration with the National Pharmaceutical

\$10,000 say they sometimes have to cut back on necessary items such as food or heating fuel to pay for a prescription. This is significantly higher than was found in 1991, when 19 percent said they sometimes had to sacrifice something else to pay for a prescription.

Plans are for the Massachusetts Senior Pharmacy Program to embark upon an active marketing and enrollment campaign in the coming months.

Budget thaw seen in home care funding

"It's a hopeful sign of spring after seven long winters." That's how John O'Neill, executive director of Somerville-Cambridge Elder Services, described the state budget released in late January by Gov. William Weld.

Featuring the first thaw in frozen home care funding in seven years, the overall home care budget
