moved in 1957 to Chicago, where she recorded songs on record labels such as C.J. Cobra and One-Derful in the late 1950s and early 1960s.

She signed a contract with Vee-Jay, a record label that was issuing hits by the Beatles at around the same time. Her release of "You're No Good" just missed the top 50 in late 1963 and was covered in the United Kingdom by the Swinging Blue Jeans. It would later be covered by Linda Ronstadt and become a hit song.

Ms. Everett recorded "The Shoop Shoop Song" in 1964, and it soared to Billboard's Top 10. "The Shoop Shoop Song" was later recorded by Cher in the soundtrack for the 1990 movie "Mermaids" and more recently by Vonda Sheppard of the Fox television show "Ally McBeal."

Other records such as "I Can't Hear You" and "Getting Mighty Crowded" extended Ms. Everett's fan base.
