

Cambridge March 22, 1927.

To the Honorable, the City Council
of the City of Cambridge:

The undersigned respectfully pray

That the City of Cambridge sell to us a narrow strip of vacant land in the rear of our lot at the corner of Ames and Main Streets as follows:

Rear of garage, a strip about 8 ft. x 49.68 ft., and rear of land on Ames Street, a strip about 8 ft. x 192.17 ft., making a total of 1935 square feet more or less for which we are willing to pay the City \$1935.00.

Also a narrow strip of land, 1 ft. wide on Main Street and running back parallel with our present land about 210.59 ft., making a total of about 210.59 square feet for which we are willing to pay the City \$300.00.

In all, a total of \$2,235.00.

If this sale can be consummated without delay, the undersigned expect at once to commence the erection of a six story concrete and brick factory building to cost not less than \$100,000.00.

WHEREAS:

An offer has been received by the City Council for the purchase of City owned land situated on Main Street, it is

ORDERED:

That His Honor the Mayor be and hereby is authorized, in the name of and in behalf of the City of Cambridge, to sell and convey to The Daggett Trust by F. L. Daggett, Mgr., Trustee, for the sum of Two Thousand Two Hundred and Thirty-five Dollars (\$2,235) a parcel of land situated and described as follows:-

Beginning at a point in the southerly line of Main Street, at the division line between land now or formerly of the Daggett Chocolate Company and land of the City of Cambridge, said point being 149.68 feet easterly from the easterly line of Ames Street, thence easterly along the said southerly line of Main Street one foot to a corner, thence southerly parallel to and one foot distant easterly from the said division line between land now or formerly of Daggett Chocolate Company and land of the City of Cambridge and hereafter described as 209.59 feet long, 217.59 feet more or less to a corner, thence westerly parallel to and 8 feet distant southerly from other division line between land now or formerly of the Daggett Chocolate Company and land of the City of Cambridge and described as 49.68 feet long, 42.68 feet more or less to a corner, thence again southerly parallel to and 8 feet distant easterly from other division line between land of now or formerly of the Daggett Chocolate Company and land now or formerly of Joseph P. Morse and land of the City of Cambridge and described as 200.17 feet long, 192.17 feet to a corner, thence westerly along land of Page and Shaw Chocolate Company 8 feet to land of now or formerly Joseph P. Morse, thence northerly along land now or formerly of said Joseph P. Morse and land now or formerly of the Daggett Chocolate Company 200.17 feet to a corner, thence easterly along other division line between land now or formerly of the Daggett Chocolate Company and land of the City of Cambridge 49.68 feet to a corner, thence again northerly along other division line between land of the now or formerly Daggett Chocolate Company and land of the City of Cambridge 209.59 feet to a corner at Main Street at the point of beginning. Containing 2,144.4 square feet more or less.

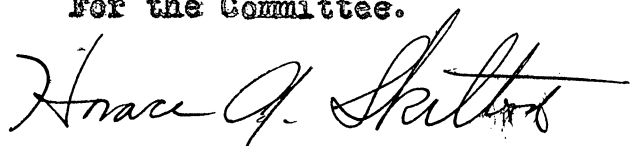
