A funeral Mass will be said today for Joseph E. McCain, a Metropolitan Police detective who was decorated for bravery during a 1988 drug bust in which he was critically wounded.

Mr. McCain died Monday in Mount Auburn Hospital in Cambridge. He was 72.

He was shot in the abdomen with a sawed-off shotgun on Jan. 29, 1988, when he charged into a house in Hyde Park to aid a fellow officer during a drug bust that went sour. A Boston police officer was also wounded in the arm during the encounter, which resulted in the death of the drug suspect after the gunfight that ensued.

Mr. McCain lost his gall bladder and spleen during surgery. The injuries ended his 30-year career as an MDC officer.

In 1989, he was awarded the state's highest honor for law enforcement officers, the George Hanna Medal of Honor.

A lifelong resident of Somerville, he served in the Navy.

For many years Mr. McCain played Santa Claus at Christmas for youngsters. "I figure I'm going to live forever because parents will always be showing pictures of their kids sitting in Santa's lap," he said in a Boston Herald story on Dec. 19, 1988.

He leaves his wife, Helen (Dunn); a son, Joseph of Somerville; a sister, Estelle O'Brien of Somerville; and three grandchildren.

The funeral Mass will be said at 10 a.m. in St. Clement Church in Somerville. Burial will be in Holy Cross Cemetery in Malden.
