- WHEREAS: This City Council was deeply saddened at learning of the death of Ewart Guinier, Professor of Afro-American Studies Emeritus at Harvard College; and
- WHEREAS: Professor Guinier, born in Panama, raised in Jamaica and educated in the Boston public school system attended Harvard from 1929 - 1931 and completed his studies at New York City College; and
- WHEREAS: Professor Guinier was active in the trade unions serving as Secretary-Treasurer of the United Public Workers from 1948 - 1953 and was the first black to run for Manhattan Borough President in 1949; and
- WHEREAS: Before coming to Harvard Professor Guinier was Associate Director of the Urban Center at Columbia University; and
- WHEREAS: Professor Guinier was appointed Chair of the Afro-American Department in 1969 and served with distinction until he stepped down as Chair in 1976, and left Harvard in 1980; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deepest sympathies to the family of Ewart Guinier at this time of such personal loss; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to the Guinier Family on behalf of the entire City Council.
