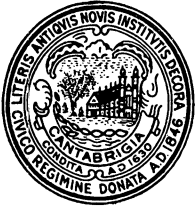

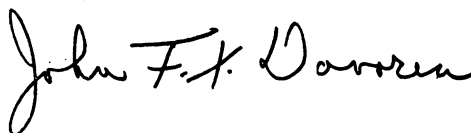

of mutual aid or federation with other associations, other groups organized on a cooperative basis, and other non-profit groups;

4. To conduct its affairs within or without the Commonwealth of Massachusetts;
5. To exercise all powers not inconsistent with the Act which may be necessary, convenient or expedient for the accomplishment of its purposes, and, to that end the foregoing enumeration of powers shall not be deemed exclusive.

2. The purposes for which the corporation is formed are as follows:

To engage in the furnishing to the patrons of the association (i. e. those who contribute to or through it) a non-profit service through which the patrons may supply or make available goods and services in the United States and foreign countries for purposes of relief, rehabilitation and reconstruction. Accordingly, the "benefit" to the patrons from the operation of this association shall be the furnishing and maintenance of the service for foreign relief, rehabilitation and reconstruction on a more efficient basis than that on which it might be individually provided by the patrons.

In carrying out the foregoing purposes, the powers of this association shall be those set forth in Chapter 180 of The General Laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts for associations incorporated thereunder. Such powers include the capacity to act possessed by natural persons and the authority to do anything required or permitted by the Act and also

1. To sue and be sued in its corporate name;
2. To acquire, own, hold, sell, lease, pledge, market or otherwise dispose of any property incident to its purpose and activities;
3. To borrow money, contract debts, and make contracts, including agreements

NOTE: If provisions for which the space provided under Articles 2, 3 and 4 is not sufficient additions should be set out on continuation sheets to be numbered 2A, 2B, etc. Indicate under each Article where the provision is set out.
