Was Metropolitan Life manager

A funeral Mass will be said this morning for Joseph Frank Pelusi, a former district manager for Metropolitan Life Insurance in Norwood and Wakefield, who died Saturday at his home in Lynnfield. He was 80.

Mr. Pelusi was born in East Boston. He graduated from East Boston High School and attended Boston University. Prior to moving to Lynnfield about 30 years ago, he had lived in Medford and Dover. He also wintered in Florida for many years.

Mr. Pelusi began his career as a general manager with the Gloria Chain Foodstores. He then went on to work for Metropolitan Life. In his 36-year career with the company, he received numerous accolades and awards for managing the top district in New England.

Mr. Pelusi was a founder of Annemark Nursing Home in Revere in 1969.

He enjoyed spending time on Cape Cod with his family at his summer home in Popponesset. He was the husband of the late Theresa (Milano) Pelusi and father of the late Joseph L. Pelusi.

He leaves three daughters, Elena A. Bean of Westwood, Linda T. Curran of Norwood and Mashpee and Anita Pelusi Carbonaro of Georgetown; a sister, Phyllis Bibb of Medford; three brothers, Frank of Saugus, Anthony of Reading and Louis of Wilmington; 12 grandchildren and three great-grandchildren.

The funeral Mass will be said at 11 a.m. in St. Maria Goretti Church in Lynnfield. Burial will be in Oak Grove Cemetery in Medford.
