### Gorin's Sales Up 12 Per Cent

Gorin Stores Inc., Boston-based department store chain with 27 stores located in New England and New York reported sales at \$21.8 million for the six months ending June 30th, compared to \$19.9 million for the same period in 1969.

Earnings after taxes were \$275,599 or 28 cents per share compared to \$174,461 or 17 cents per share in 1969. Included in earnings for 1970, however, is a one-time gain of \$110,000 from sale of real estate taken over by Urban Renewal.

The company operates Almy's Dept. Store in Central square.

### Unemployment Reported Up

The Massachusetts unemployment rate jumped from 4.8 percent in May to 5.7 percent in June with nearly 150,000 individuals jobless, reported Herman V. LaMark, Director of the State Division of Employment Security.

Layoffs were less responsible than was a sharp increase of 50,000 in the workforce in the month while job opportunities grew by only 26,000. Employment statewide reached the highest June level yet recorded but the number at work is up only 2,300 in the past year while unemployment is higher by over 40,000.

LaMark pointed out that unemployment often peaks for the year in June and July when the job market is flooded by June graduates, youth hunting summer jobs, and housewives liberated by school closings. Economists have noted a startling growth in recent months in the proportion of women entering the job market which has intensified the unemployment problem.
