- WHEREAS: The City of Cambridge has been deeply pained by the loss of precious life due to the AIDS epidemic, an epidemic that has afflicted our nation over the past fifteen years; and
- WHEREAS: The Fenway Community Health Center has for the past twenty years worked to support the gay and lesbian community in the greater Boston area, a community disproportionately affected by the AIDS epidemic; and
- WHEREAS: The Fenway Community Health Center works to fight AIDS by providing education on the prevention of AIDS, moneys for research into a cure, and medical and counseling services for individuals living with AIDS and their families; and
- WHEREAS: On September 15th one thousand cyclists will take part in The Fenway Community Health Center's Boston to New York **AIDS Bike Ride**, an event through which The Fenway Community Health Center hopes to raise three million dollars, money desperately needed to continue the fight against AIDS; and
- WHEREAS: The City of Cambridge is determined to forge on until a cure for AIDS has been found; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That this City Council does hereby register its strong support for The Fenway Community Health Center's AIDS Bike Ride, and strongly encourage the residents of Cambridge to support this noble event in any way possible.
