March 18, 1985

- WHEREAS: Recent events in South Africa have caused people throughout the world to redouble their efforts aimed at ending that nation's racist and abhorrent policy of apartheid; and
- WHEREAS: Cambridge voters at the November 6, 1979 city election overwhelmingly approved Question 5, advising the city government to "refrain from investing monies in banks and other financial institutions doing business in or with the Republic of South Africa;" and
- WHEREAS: By Order No. 7 of February 11, 1980, this City Council asked the Assistant City Manager for Fiscal Affairs and the Retirement Board to implement this decision within their respective jurisdictions, and was subsequently informed that both would do so gradually; therefore, be it
- ORDERED: That the City Manager report in writing as soon as possible on the progress to date in implementing the voters' 1979 mandate.

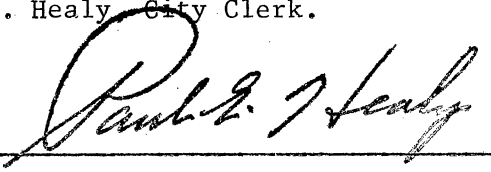
