- WHEREAS: The late Alphonse Carbone, a native of Cambridge and a veteran of twenty-one years with the United States Marine Corp, passed away in 1983; and
- WHEREAS: Al was well known in the East Cambridge community for his friendliness, charm and sense of humor; and
- WHEREAS: Throughout his military career he served in a variety of locations, including Nicaragua, the Antarctic and China; and
- WHEREAS: During World War II he participated in the invasion of Guadalcanal, Solomon Islands and the South Pacific; and;
- WHEREAS: Al, upon being honorably discharged from the Marine Corp, was appointed as a Capitol Police Officer and worked in that capacity for some time prior to having a heart attack causing his retirement; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council, in recognition of this Cambridge native, military veteran, recipient of the Navy Cross, the Congressional Service Medal and other military awards, go on record naming the corner of Fifth Street and Winter Street as **"MASTER TECHNICAL SERGEANT ALFONSE CARBONE SQUARE"** in memory of this fine American.
