- WHEREAS: This City Council was deeply saddened upon learning of the death of Cambridge native and long time political activist John J. Carver; and
- WHEREAS: John attended local schools and went on to graduate from Exeter Academy, New Hampshire and Harvard College in 1930, as well as having attended Boston College Law School; and
- WHEREAS: John served as a Cambridge public official as both a member of the City Council in 1937 and School Committee from 1938 to 1947 and served as a trustee of the Cambridge Hospital for fourteen years, where he diligently worked on formulating policy which relates to health care delivery; and
- WHEREAS: John was a career employee of the New England Telephone and Telegraph Company, beginning as a lineman and worked his way up the career ladder to attain the position of general public affairs manager for the New England region, a position he held until his retirement in 1969; and
- WHEREAS: John, not one to remain inactive, was appointed in 1977 by Congressman Thomas P. O'Neill to head his Watertown district office, a position he truly enjoyed and which provided him an opportunity to assist people throughout the district with wide ranging problems; and concerns; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deepest sympathy to Mrs. Mary Carver and the entire family at this time of such personal loss; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to Mrs. Carver on behalf of the entire City Council.
