

FDA orders recall of company's eye cosmetics

WASHINGTON — All the eye cosmetics manufactured by a New Jersey company during the past two years are being recalled because they may contain bacteria that could cause blindness, the Food and Drug Administration said Thursday.

The mascara, liquid eye liner and eye shadow was supplied to beauty salons, discount and department stores, skin care clinics and cosmetics distributors in Puerto Rico, Canada and eight states, including Texas.

The FDA said some was sold in bulk, with the consumer-size units marketed under the brand names Ana Orsini, Annabelle, Eve's, Lauren's and On Stage Cosmetics.

Reagan lifts sanctions

WASHINGTON — President Reagan lifted economic sanctions against Poland on Thursday but warned the Warsaw government not to retreat on political reforms. "We will be watching to see that further steps are taken toward national reconciliation in Poland and that the progress made is not reversed," Reagan said.

The Polish government estimates its economy has lost \$15 billion because of Western sanctions imposed after the martial law crackdown on the Solidarity trade union in December 1981.

In other news . . .

■ In Washington, the Reagan administration unveiled 29 pages of guidelines for the collection and laboratory testing of urine samples under its mandatory drug testing program for government workers in sensitive positions.

■ In Hackensack, N.J., Mary Beth Whitehead testified Thursday that one day she'll tell her child the surrogate agreement she broke was a mistake.

■ The New York City Health Department will give away a million condoms in the coming year to help fight AIDS, a department spokesman said. The department has been dispensing free condoms to family planning clinics, health fairs and community organizations for several years. No figures are available on the number of condoms distributed in the past, but an extra \$300,000 appropriation will allow the continuing effort.
