- WHEREAS: The Community League of Women for Community Service is celebrating its annual meeting and 90th anniversary on Saturday, June 14th, 2008;
- WHEREAS: Maria L. Baldwin, the first president of the League of Women for Community Service, was born in Cambridge on September 13, 1856; and
- WHEREAS: Maria L. Baldwin was an African American educator and civic leader; and
- WHEREAS: Maria L. Baldwin served as Master of Agassiz School for forty years; and
- WHEREAS: On February 12th, 2004, Agassiz School was officially renamed the Maria L. Baldwin School; and
- WHEREAS: The League of Women for Community Service is honored to have a Cambridge Public School named after their first president; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That the City Council goes on record congratulating the League of Women for Community Service for their celebration of 90 years of service; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to the League of Women for Community Service on behalf of the entire City Council.
