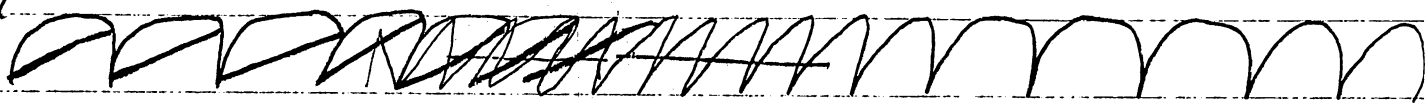

The MACRS Preretirement Planning Committee has had several meetings and has focused on the development and implementation of educational seminars.

They have determined that Retirement Planning, for educational purposes, consists of two categories: Benefit Calculations and Preretirement Planning, a topic which covers various issues.

Two methods regarding Benefit Calculations were discussed. The first would consist of MACRS supplying a kit including an information booklet for each member, a slide presentation, and a presenter's workshop. Each board could implement their own Benefits Calculation Program with the materials provided. The second method would involve regionalizing the presentation and having MACRS conduct the entire seminar.

The committee feels that a Preretirement Planning Program would be best conducted by taking a "regional approach." MACRS would plan an entire one day agenda of speakers in a particular region and each board in that region could send a certain number of participants.
