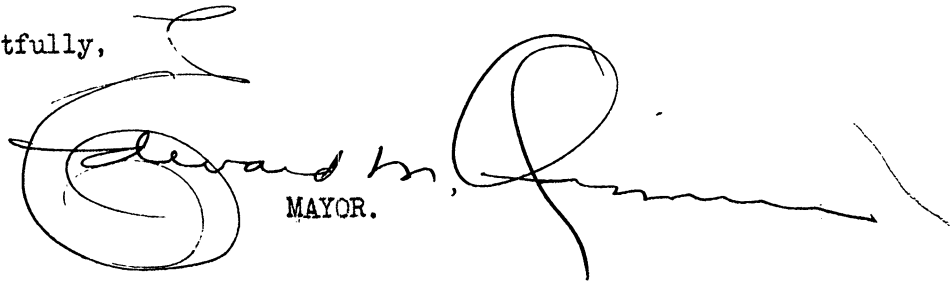
To the Honorable the City Council:-

Albert S. Apsey a life long resident of this City died at his home on Thursday, September 29th and I am calling your attention to this, so that proper action may be taken by the City Council, as a tribute of respect to his memory.

Mr. Apsey, was a member of the old Common Council during the years, 1895, 1896 and 1897. During the last year, he was President of the Common Council. From 1898 to 1901 inclusive, he was a Representative in the Legislature and during the years 1902 and 1903 he was a member of the State Senate.

Since the time, when he relinquished office, he had never lost interest in the public service and was a keen, public spirited citizen. I shall be glad to join with you in such action as your Board may take as a tribute of respect to his memory.

The attention of the City Council has been called by His Honor the Mayor to the passing away of Albert S. Apsey a life-long resident of Cambridge and a former member of the City Government it is fitting and proper that record should be made of its tribute of esteem and regard to his memory.

Mr. Apsey was a member of the Common Council from 1895 until 1898 the last year serving as its presiding officer. In the year 1897 he was elected to the State Legislature and served with distinction until the end of the year 1901. During the years 1902 and 1903 he served in the State Senate and from that time until his death, although he did not again aspire to hold public office, he never lost interest in affairs and was a keen, public spirited citizen.
