To The Honorable City Council:

Over this past weekend and during today the Director of Budget-Personnel in his capacity as the City Manpower Administrator has been working with the Regional Office of the Department of Labor and with the Office of Manpower Affairs in an effort to ascertain the current funding status of the NYC-Summer Job Program.

As you have undoubtedly heard through the news media last Friday, a Federal District Court ordered the President to release the \$293 million previously impounded for N.Y.C. Summer Jobs and in the event of an appeal directed that the funds be frozen so that they would not revert to the general fund.


Subsequent to that court action, the Regional Office of the Department of Labor notified the Office of Manpower Affairs, the Chairman of the Ancillary Manpower Planning Board and the Director of the N.Y.C. Program to take appropriate action to secure full funding upon the receipt of formal funding levels from Washington.

As of four (4) o'clock this afternoon it appears that the Federal Office of Management and Budget apparently had sought to appeal the decision of the Federal District Court and had been denied in that motion. Therefore, as I prepare this communication Field Representatives in the Regional Office of the Department of Labor are meeting in Boston to determine funding levels and the proper administrative process. The City of Cambridge, acting on its own behalf and that of the other communities in the regional manpower planning area, have urged D.O.L. and the Office of Manpower Affairs to work diligently to insure proper and prompt funding for this important program.

It is anticipated that Cambridge will receive approximately \$240,000 which will provide employment for approximately 560 youngsters.

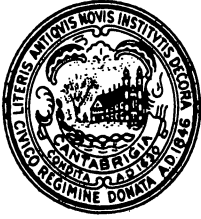
You can be assured that I shall monitor our programs in this regard to insure proper action.
