- WHEREAS: Christi's parents Robert and Joanne, are former Cantabrigians who graduated from the Cambridge Public School System and maintain their roots here in Cambridge by staying in contact with their many friends and relatives; and
- WHEREAS: Some of the Cook's friends include Cambridge taxi drivers who, through their spokesman Arthur Santoro said, "the taxi drivers decided they wanted to do something for the family", and that "something" will be a dance at the Hyatt Regency Hotel on July 12, 1983 from 7:00 p.m. to 11:00 p.m.; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record endorsing the humanitarian efforts of the Cambridge taxi drivers on behalf of Christi Cook; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That July 12, 1983 be named "Christi Cook Day" in recognition of this very brave little girl and that this City Council go on record urging all Cantabrigians and friends of the Cook family to participate in this meaningful event.
