Dear Mr. Corcoran:

In regard to a City Council Order requesting that I prohibit Heavy Trucking from using Concord Avenue from Fresh Pond Circle to Harvard Square and on Garden Street between the City Dump and Harvard Square: I wish to inform you that Concord Avenue is an Emergency Artery and as such does carry a large volume of traffic and to try to remove any trucking from this street would only put this traffic on some other City street. It is also my opinion that the suitable alternate route that is needed for any restriction cannot be found.

It would also be almost impossible to enforce, due to all the businesses in this area that require deliveries.

We are at this time trying to legalize truck restriction on Garden Street but again the only suitable alternate route for Garden Street would be Concord Avenue.

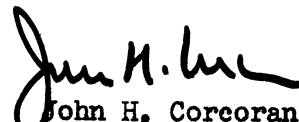
