On behalf of the Harvard Square Business Association, I would respectfully request that the City Council grant permission for our organization to hold its sixth annual MayFair in Harvard Square on Sunday, May 7, 1989 (with a raindate set for Sunday, May 21st) from noon to 6 p.m.

Permission to hold the MayFair in Harvard Square would involve granting the following conditions:

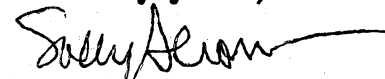
1) Permission to hold a non-alcoholic Sunday street fair on two blocks of JFK street (from the corner of Mt. Auburn street to Church street) and on part of Brattle street (up to Church street) on Sunday, May 7, 1989, with provision for a raindate Sunday, May 21 (skipping Mother's Day, Sunday, May 14);

2) Overnight posting on May 6 (or May 20) in order to close part of JFK and Brattle street to traffic on May 7 (or May 21) from 9:30 a.m. until 7:30 p.m. to allow for set-up and for clean-up;

3) Placing kiddie rides in Harvard Square behind a temporary bandstand for international entertainment at the intersection of Brattle and JFK street, leaving a 12-foot fire lane open for emergency vehicles. In the past, the kiddie rides have been located in Brattle Square.

The Harvard Square Business Association would again be responsible for providing supervision, public facilities, clean-up, and security for the Harvard Square MayFair.
