

Although I physically leave as an official in the great "University" city, I will always be here in spirit and thought. The time has come and I must go but my services will be available whenever possible.

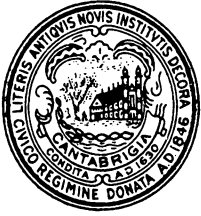


