- WHEREAS: Numerous queries have been made, and great confusion seems to exist regarding whether or not New Street will be re-opened to through traffic; and
- WHEREAS: The B&M Railroad is "holding up the works" with the reconstruction of the tracks, making it impossible to make a grade crossing; and
- WHEREAS: Exit access to Fresh Pond Parkway from the shopping center is only available from Concord Lane which is in deplorable condition; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That if the B&M Railroad will not act on requests made by the City, that our State Representatives be contacted and requested to converse with them with the view in mind of getting that road open before winter; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That repairs be made to the surface of Concord Lane to make it safe to traverse.
