C. Brendan Noonan Jr., real estate agent, at 56

C. Brendan "Brandy" Noonan Jr. of Belmont, a prominent Cambridge Realtor, died Sunday at his home following a lengthy bout with prostate cancer. He was 56.

Born in Cambridge, Mr. Noonan was a graduate of Sacred Heart High School in East Cambridge and pursued further education at Boston University and the Portia School of Law.

For 30 years, he was the proprietor of C. Brendan & Co., Real Estate Brokers in Cambridge, succeeding his late father, C. Brendan Noonan Sr.

An avid boater, Mr. Noonan was a member of the Charles River Yacht Club. He was fond of riding his boat "One of Us" around Boston Harbor and along the South Shore.

Mr. Noonan was a member of the Oakley Country Club in Belmont and was a director of Bay State Federal Savings Bank in Brookline.

He was also active in the Greater Boston Real Estate Board and the Cambridge Chamber of Commerce. He was active with Homeowners Rehab, a Cambridge group organized to create sources of affordable housing in that city.

A former Marine reservist, Mr. Noonan was a member of the Semper Fidelis So-

ciety. In Belmont, he was a member of the McLean Hospital Task Force.

Mr. Noonan leaves his wife, Patricia (Merigan), a son, C. Brendan III of Belmont; two daughters, Mary Beth Goulding of Medford and Allison of Belmont; his mother, Mary Noonan, a sister, William Harris of Duxbury, and two granddaughters.

A funeral Mass will be celebrated at 10 a.m. tomorrow at St. Joseph's Church in Belmont. Burial will be in Cambridge Cemetery.
