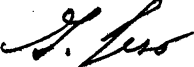

Subject City Council Order #11 of February 27, 1978-"Making Leonard Ave.
and Washburn Ave. One Way streets

The Traffic and Parking Department has completed a study of Leonard Avenue and the results are that this street will be made one way from Line Street to Cambridge Street. As soon as the legal regulation is promulgated and advertised in the local newspaper the actual posting of signs will be done.

As for making Washburn Avenue one way, a meeting will be held with residents of the street including the section in the City of Somerville to discuss this proposal. The meeting will be held on Monday March 13, 1978 at 7 PM at the Powder House Community School on Broadway Somerville. The reason for this meeting is that half of Washburn Avenue is in Somerville and both communities must agree before the State will issue a permit to make it one way.

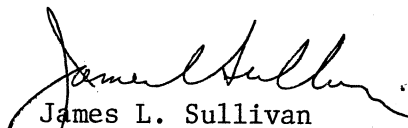
