P.F.C. JOHN W. CROWLEY, Born May 5, 1911, on Gore st. Cambridge, Mass. Attended Sacred Heart & Cambridge High & Latin schools. Entered the Army March 9, 1943. Killed in action in Normandy, France, June 8, 1944. Square suggested for Crowley at Fourth & Gore Sts. Survived by wife.

Sgt. RALPH J. STROZZI, Born Feb. 9, 1913, 130 Harvard St. Cambridge, Mass. Attended St. Mary's & Rindge Tech. Entered the Army 1942. Killed at Anzio, Italy, June, 1944. Resided on Third St, most of his life. Survived by brother and sister. One brother is a member of Cambridge Police Dept. Square suggested is corner of Third & Gore Sts.

P.F.C. ANTHONY C. DIVISANO, Born on Ninth St. Oct. 14, 1921 in Cambridge. Resided later at 11 Fourth St. Entered Army Aug. 1944. Killed March 23, 1945 in France. Attended St. Francis and Rindge Tech. Survived by wife and children. Square suggested. Winter and Fourth Sts.

John W. Crowley killed in action in France, June 8, 1944.

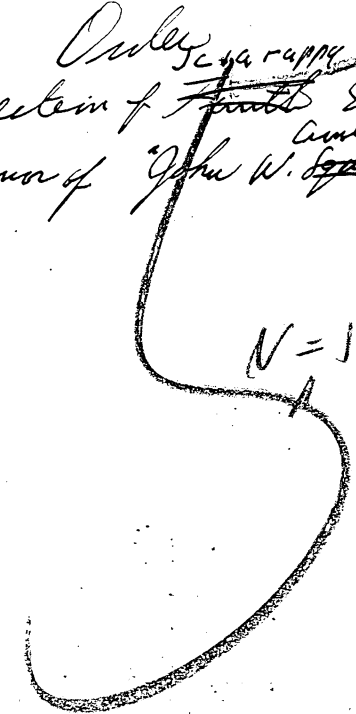
