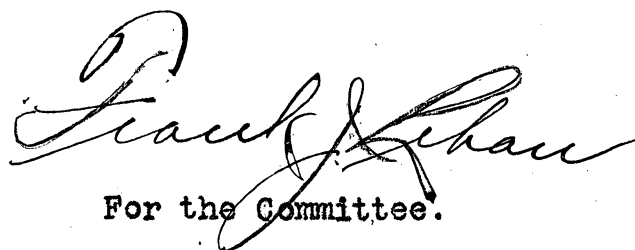

That the public convenience and public health require that a common sewer should be laid in Blakeslee Street, a private way so-called, and that a right of way twenty (20) feet in width through the middle of said street should be taken for such purpose and bounded and described as follows:

Beginning at a point in the westerly line of Blakeslee Street 319 ft. southerly from the intersection of said line with the southerly line of Huron Avenue, thence running easterly 20.12 ft. to the intersection of the division line between land formerly of F. A. Kennedy and land of the Devisees of Charles C.
