To The Honorable, The City Council:

I am hereby requesting an appropriation of \$80,000 in the Grant Fund of the Community Development Department Other Ordinary Maintenance Account. The State Transportation Demand Management (TDM) Program has awarded funds for the development and installation of four electronic kiosks that will provide the general public with information on alternative transportation services. The City has identified five locations, four of these will ultimately be chosen based on technical and physical constraints and requirements. This appropriation will make a significant contribution to the City's continuing efforts to promote transportation demand management and alternative modes of transportation, thereby improving air quality, reducing traffic congestion and improving the quality of life in Cambridge. It will also support the City's goals of providing information to citizens in a convenient and user-friendly way, using state of the art technology.
