Adelyn A. Stone


On the first ballot, to determine the Committee's first choice, the results were as follows:

The Committee submits to you for your consideration as Election Commissioner, the names of Messrs. Samp and Solomons and Mrs. Stone, in that order.

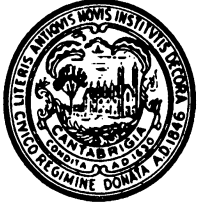


