RE: City Council Order # 6: Report on when the Cambridgeport Neighborhood Study will be available.

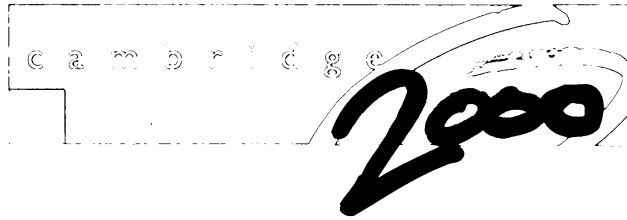
In response to the above referenced council order, I report the following:

The Cambridgeport Neighborhood Study began in Feb 1997 under the guidance of a neighborhood study committee of 10 members. The Committee met approximately twice per month until January 1999. The committee worked with the Community Development Department to discuss and make recommendations on housing, land use, zoning and urban design, open space, transportation and economic development issues in the Cambridgeport neighborhood. During this time, five public forums were held at the Graham and Parks School to allow the committee to hear public opinion on the range of topics under discussion.

A draft of the report was circulated to the study committee in the spring of 1999. Numerous comments were received and incorporated into the report based on this review. The report details the background, discussion and recommendations in the following areas:

- Housing
- Land Use, Zoning and Urban Design
- Transportation
- Open Space
- Economic Development

The study will be available to the public the week of May 22, 2000. We will then schedule a public meeting to discuss the final report with the neighborhood.
