Dear Cambridge City Council member,

I write you as a life-long citizen of Cambridge regarding the soccer field at Fresh Pond, commonly known as Lusitania Field. It would be sadly unhelpful to the quality of life in Cambridge were the City to cut back any of the recreational facilities which it is so fortunate to possess. Considering our population and its interests there are far too few fields of play as it is. To alter the status of a facility already long in place and customarily used seems a reckless and unjust innovation. It flies both in face of need and demand.

I recall the Lusitania Soccer Field from the 1960's. I founded in that decade a soccer team called the Harvard-M.I.T. Graduate School Soccer Team. We were fortunate in having the fields of those two respective schools on which to play. We looked for other clubs to play. Portuguese teams responded, one being San Cristobal from East
