I. New Construction of Low Income Housing

A. \$100 Million for Chapter 705 Family Public Housing

This is for scattered site public housing for families. Housing authorities can also use funds to purchase a unit in a Homeownership Opportunity Program development and rent it to an eligible family.

B. \$66.6 Million for Chapter 667 Elderly Public Housing

C. \$22 Million for Handicapped and Special Needs Housing

Local housing authorities apply for these funds to EOCD (Executive Office of Communities & Development), the state's housing agency.

II. Funding for Low and Moderate Income Rental Housing & Cooperatives

A. \$30 Million for Housing Innovations Fund

For funding innovative kinds of housing like limited equity tenant cooperatives to prevent displacement of current tenants, single room occupancy housing to prevent homelessness, transitional housing for the homeless, battered women's shelters, mutual housing, veteran's congregate housing.

Community Development Corporations (CDC's), limited equity cooperatives, and housing authorities are eligible to apply for the funds, but can also subcontract with any other non-profit organization.

B. \$10 Million for Rental Housing Development Action Grant (RHDAG)

For "gap financing" for low/moderate income rental housing or cooperatives to enable more units to have affordable rent levels. Non-profit groups, local government, & housing authorities can apply for the funds. These are lower interest loans. Priority to projects in areas of greatest need, ones with highest % of low income units, ones with most units of 3 or more bedrooms. This is a state version of the federal Urban Development Action Grant (UDAG), but targeted to housing.

III. Lower Interest Rate Mortgages for Affordable Homeownership

\$15 million for the Homeownership Opportunity Program aimed at financing lower interest rate mortgages so families earning \$20-30,000 can afford to buy a home. Has been used for new construction of homes so far. Funds can also be used for financing tenant cooperatives.

IV. Renovations of Current Public Housing

A. \$95 million for renovation of state financed public housing

Can be used for major repairs and for asbestos removal and deleading. \$1 million is set aside for construction of day care facilities or renovation of existing space for this.

B. \$50 million for renovation of federally financed public housing

Priority to use funds for presently vacant units but some must be spent on occupied, but deteriorated units. Can be used for asbestos removal and deleading too. \$1 million set aside for construction of day care facilities or renovation of existing space for this.

C. \$15 million for Chapter 884 public housing renovation program
