- WHEREAS: It is the intention of this City government, in issuing resident parking permits and designating many residential streets as "Residents Only" parking areas, to provide safe, accessible street parking for Cambridge residents; and
- WHEREAS: On Everett Street and in streets nearby, many cars without resident parking permits are illegally parked at all hours of the day and night, and while some ticketing does occur, many cars remain illegally parked during the crucial hours between 12 noon and 2:00 p.m. and 5:00 to 7:00 p.m.; and
- WHEREAS: This violation of the resident parking regulations deprives actual residents of the area of safe, accessible parking on the streets where they live; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council request the City Manager to direct the Department of Traffic and Parking to review the non-resident parking of cars, particularly between the hours of 12-noon and 2:00 p.m. and 5:00 to 7:00 p.m., in the Everett Street area, and report back within two weeks.
