VICE MAYOR REEVES

- WHEREAS: It is of concern to this City Council that Cambridge sidewalks offer safe access to all people including those who are frail of have physical disabilities; and
- WHEREAS: Neighborhood residents have pointed out that portions of the sidewalk in between the cemetery and Sherman Street on Rindge Avenue have become difficult to negotiate due to break-up from tree roots, and general wear and tear; and
- WHEREAS: This condition is exacerbated by winter conditions of snow and ice; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That the City Council request the City Manager to alert the appropriate city departments of this problem and report back within three weeks with a plan for alleviating this condition; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That in evaluating this problem, the City Manager contact Mr. James Harlow of Jackson Place and Ms. Gail Enman, Director of the Cambridge Commission on the Handicapped.

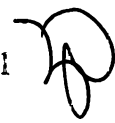
