WHEREAS: The City of Cambridge is committed to improving air quality and reducing traffic congestion because of concern about the levels of automobile travel and congestion; and

WHEREAS: The City of Cambridge is encouraging the implementation of Transportation Demand Management (TDM) as a means of improving the environment and quality of life by encouraging the use of transportation options (walking, cycling, ridesharing, public transit); and

WHEREAS: The business community plays an important role in implementing TDM and many Cambridge businesses have already implemented a variety of TDM measures for their employees; and
