American Telecommunications Enterprise, Inc., doing business under the name American Telecom, a Florida corporation with its headquarters in New York, seeks permission from the Department of Public Utilities to provide resold telecommunications services within the Commonwealth of Massachusetts. American Telecom proposes to offer automated and live operator services to traffic-aggregator locations.

This investigation is officially captioned:

Application of American Telecommunications Enterprise, Inc., under the provisions of Chapter 159 of the General Laws, as amended, for a certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate as a resale, value-added, or interexchange common carrier within the Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

Comments, objections and requests for a public hearing on the proposed service must be made in writing with specific reasons for requesting a public hearing, and filed with the Secretary of the Department on or before June 21, 1993.

The petitioner, American Telecommunications Enterprise, Inc., is required to give notice by publication hereof once, in the Boston Globe, the Morning Union (Springfield), the Berkshire Eagle (Pittsfield) and the Worcester Telegram, and to serve a copy hereof at least twenty-one (21) days prior to said date [June 28, 1993], on the Other Common Carriers on the attached OCC list, and to make return of service and publication no later than July 7, 1993.
